Academic Factors

Academic preparation and, in particular, the strength of the college preparatory coursework, are important components of any admissions decision. The course requirements listed below represent the minimum distribution expected. Most applicants will exceed this distribution.

- * **4 units** - English
- * **3 units** - Social Science
- * **3 units** - Mathematics (Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra 2)
- * **3 units** - Science
- * **4 units** - Additional Academic Electives (additional courses from above or foreign language or fine arts or computer science)

UW Oshkosh 3-Year Profile of Admitted Students

The following data provides a summary of the academic profile for admitted freshmen from 2005-2007. Applicants may wish to use this as a benchmark to estimate the likelihood of admission. Since all applications are given a comprehensive review that takes into consideration factors already noted, the data should not be interpreted as a guarantee of admission or prediction for denial.

UW Oshkosh Freshman Admitted, 2005-2007

- * Mean ACT = 22.6
- * Mean Class Rank Percentile = 71
- * 54% of all applicants were first generation college students

More than 27% of the admitted freshmen ranked in the top 10% of their high school graduating class and had an ACT composite score of 25 or higher. Nearly 42% of all admits ranked in the top 30% of their high school graduating class and had an ACT composite score of 21 or higher. Only approximately 1.5% of all applicants had an ACT composite of 22 or less and ranked in the lower 30% of their high school graduating class.
