General Education / Degree Requirements

(These requirements apply only to students using the Fall 2007 Bulletin or later for the B.A. degree.)

All Bachelor of Arts students must satisfy general education requirements set by the College of Letters & Science and satisfy the foreign language requirement specific to the Bachelor of Arts degree.

- 1. Complete a minimum of 42 credits of general education
2. Complete the fourth term of study in a single, approved foreign language, or test beyond the fourth term of study in a foreign language on the UW System Foreign Language Placement Exam
3. Complete an academic major and, if required, an academic minor
4. Achieve the specified, minimum cumulative grade point average as required by the declared major
5. Meet course grade requirements and minimum grade point average requirements within major / minor
6. Complete a minimum of 35 upper level credits (300 and 400 level course work) with a minimum grade point average of 2.0 across all attempted upper-level credits

Notes: 1) If you have earned an associate or baccalaureate degree at a UW College or University, see your UARC advisor regarding requirements that may have already been met. 2) An (H) indicates a University Honors Program approved course.

Basic Knowledge and Skills
