INTRO TO HUMAN SERVICES (ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAM INTRO COURSES)

1. Declared Human Services Major
 2. Minimum 56 credits completed
 3. Minimum Cumulative GPA: 2.4
 4. Completion of (or plans to complete) 150 hours of pre-program experience. (See #5 under Admission I)
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PLEASE NOTE: Applications for both Intermediate and Major Field Experience (as well as the Pre-Program Work Agency Report for your 150 pre-program hours) may be obtained from (and must be returned to) the College of Education & Human Services Field Experience Office, N/E-113.

DEADLINES: **October 1 for Spring classes and March 1 for Summer and Fall classes**

ADMISSION I (OFFICIAL ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM AND TO INTERMEDIATE FIELD PLACEMENT)

1. Completion of a minimum of three courses in the Human Services major, as follows:
 - 203 Introduction to Human Services
 - 310 Interpersonal Relations in the Helping Professions
 - One additional **core** course, **either** 315 or 320.
2. Human Services grade point average: 2.75
3. University grade point average: 2.50
4. Completion of at least 65 credits.
5. Completion of 150 hours of pre-program experience done outside of human services classes (to be completed prior to beginning Intermediate Field placement.)

PLEASE NOTE: This 150 hours' experience may be volunteer or paid, and may include up to three different sites. Possible experiences ... work at a summer camp for kids with disabilities, summer rec work with youth, long-term babysitting (nannying), most work related to non-profit agencies, etc., etc. If you have any questions about your specific experience(s), PLEASE call Carol Botz in the Human Services Office ... 920-424-0881.
6. Positive faculty recommendation.

ADMISSION II (ADMISSION TO MAJOR FIELD PLACEMENT)

1. Completion of all Human Services **required program** Courses (except, 410 may be taken concurrently)
2. Human Services grade point average: 3.0
3. Cumulative grade point: 2.75
4. Positive faculty recommendation

FOR STUDENTS WHO WISH TO COMPLETE AN OUT-OF-AREA MAJOR FIELD PLACEMENT:

1. Cumulative grade point of: 3.0
2. Human Services grade point of: 3.5
3. "A" in intermediate field
4. Positive report from initial experience in 203
5. Positive report from 150-hour pre-program experience
6. Unanimous approval by faculty

ACADEMIC ADVISING INFORMATION:

- Application for graduation must be made one semester prior to the semester in which you plan to graduate. Applications are available online through the Registrar's Office website.
- **Note:** 120 degree credits is the minimum number of credits required for graduation.
- **Note:** Students who enrolled prior to Fall, 1998, must see an advisor for admission requirements.
