General Education / Degree Requirements

These requirements apply only to students using the Fall 2010 Bulletin or later for the B.S.W. degree

To be eligible for consideration for admission to the BSW program, students must:

1. Complete the designated General Education requirements for the social work degree, plus complete Social Work (93) 167, 220 and 298. **NOTE:** *All general education and pre-professional Social Work courses must be completed or in-progress at the time of application for admission to the BSW program, except the following: Social Work 105, Advanced English Composition, and 9 credits of general education Humanities*
2. Achieve a 2.50 cumulative grade point average (CGPA) across the General Education course work required for admission to the social work degree program
3. Earn a minimum grade of "C" in SW 167, 220 and 298 and a minimum gpa of 2.75 across these SW courses
4. Be positively recommended for admission to the program by the faculty teaching SW 167, 198 and 220
5. Provide documentation of professional commitment and volunteer participation (50 volunteer hours required)
6. Accept the ethical standards and demonstrate the ethical conduct expected of social work professionals as stipulated by the NASW Code of Ethics

The BSW Admissions Committee will make exceptions to these standards only upon submission of evidence by the applicant which offers a convincing record of merit for reconsideration.

To be eligible for graduation with a BSW degree, students must fulfill all general baccalaureate degree requirements set by the College of Letters & Science and meet the following four expectations:

1. Fulfill all remaining course requirements.*
2. Maintain a 2.75 CGPA across social work courses, with grades of "C" or better in each course. The required minimum of a 2.75 CGPA is to be calculated using all department courses.
3. Be admitted to the Applied Generalist Practicum.
4. Successfully complete the Applied Generalist Practicum.
