

<p>Praxis I Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) Information</p>

Why do I have to take the Praxis I? When should I take the Praxis I?

The Praxis I is required by the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) for admission to teacher preparation programs. All Education students must have passing scores on all three tests **prior to applying** for program entry.

Elementary and Secondary Education students apply for program entry the semester before they take the course “Individual, School, and Society.” Special and Dual Education students apply for program entry during their Sophomore Practicum semester. **Remember: All Students must have passing scores on the Praxis I prior to applying for program entry.**

It is recommended that the Praxis I be taken **no later than the second semester of your freshman year.** Failure to take this test in a timely manner will delay your eligibility to apply to the College of Education & Human Services (COEHS). When scheduling, allow enough time to receive official scores prior to the Program Entry Application Date (September 15 fall and February 15 for spring).

Cost	All 3 Tests = \$170 (\$50 registration fee + \$40/test fee)

Test Results	Written results in approximately 6 weeks for all 3 tests.

If Your Primary Language is not English (PLNE)

Nonstandard test accommodations (extended testing time) may be available for test takers whose primary language is not English. Test takers who meet ETS requirements will be allowed 50 percent additional testing time. Your request for PLNE accommodations must include the following:

- A completed Certification of Documentation form
- A completed Eligibility Form for Examinees whose Primary Language is not English
- A completed registration form for paper-based tests (or CBT Authorization Voucher Request Form for Praxis I Computerized PPST tests) and appropriate fees.
