

2009 NCAA MIDWEST REGIONAL CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS
MEDICAL/ ATHLETIC TRAINING INFORMATION

The University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Sports Medicine Staff would like to welcome your school to this year's NCAA Midwest Regional Cross Country Championships to be held at Lake Breeze Golf Course. The following information pertains to athletic training and medical coverage for the championship.

- Athletes needing treatments will need to go to the Kolf Sports Center on the UW Oshkosh campus. Treatments will be performed from 11:00am until 6:00 pm on Friday, November 13th and 8:30am until 10:00am on Saturday, November 14th. The Kolf Sports Medicine Facility is supplied with muscle stim, ultrasound, combination stim/ US, hot packs, ice and whirlpools. Any athlete needing modalities must have a signed letter from their Certified Athletic Trainer or Team Physician stating the parameters of the treatment to be rendered.
- Taping procedures and emergency services ONLY, will be provided at the golf course both Friday, November 13th and Saturday, November 14th.
- Each team is responsible for bringing a fully stocked medical kit along with insurance and emergency contact information.
- Ice, water and cups will be provided at the golf course during the competition.
- Licensed Athletic Trainer's along with Athletic Training Students will be present both Friday and Saturday of the meet.
- Physician along with EMT's and ambulance services will be on-site during race day competition times only.
- Aurora Medical Center will provide emergency needs during the competition. Aurora is located in Oshkosh, approximately 20 minutes from Lake Breeze Golf Course.
- If you have any special needs or requests, please notify Wade Peitersen, Head Athletic Trainer, and all efforts will be made to accompany your request.
