### ATHLETIC TRAINING/ MEDICAL INFORMATION 2009 DIVISION III REGIONAL VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Athletic Training Staff would like to congratulate both you and your team on qualifying for this year's Division III Regional Volleyball Championships. The following information pertains to athletic training and medical coverage, which will be supplied throughout the entire tournament. Please do not hesitate in contacting us with any questions that you may have.

- Athletic Training Facility is located on the lower level of the Kolf Sports Center Fieldhouse in which the championship will be played. It is located in room 169.
- The Kolf Athletic Training Facility is the main facility on campus. It is a 6400 square foot facility that is comprised of hydrotherapy, taping, wound care, treatment and rehabilitation areas. The following modalities are available for athletes: hot whirlpool, cold whirlpool, hot packs, ice bags, ice cups, muscle stim, ultrasound, combination stim/ US, TENS units, iontophoresis, jobst compression, diathermy, and traction. An abundant supply of rehab equipment is also available for use if needed.
- Licensed Athletic Trainers along with Athletic Training Students will be present throughout the entire championship.
- Athletic Training Facility will be open 2 ½ hours prior to the first game on each day of the event and will close approximately ½ hour after the conclusion of the final match each day.
- If you have any special needs or requests, please notify Jennifer Zuberbier, Assistant Athletic Trainer and all efforts will be made to accompany your request.
- Teams not traveling with a Certified Athletic Trainer and needing any type of electrical modality must have a note signed by a Team Physician or Certified Athletic Trainer in order for the modality to be given.
- UW Oshkosh will have staff on hand to help all teams in preparation for their contest. Each team is to bring their own supplies.
- Each bench will be supplied with water, cups and towels.
- The Student Health Center and its staff will be available Wednesday through Friday of the event for any general medical injuries or conditions. Visiting teams should be aware that any medication or supplies given to them by the Student Health Center would need to be paid for after the appointment.
- Team physicians Dr. John Swanson and Dr. Patrick McKenzie will be on call throughout the entire tournament for any specific medical needs.
- Aurora Medical Center will provide any emergency needs throughout the entire tournament. Directions to the hospital have been provided in this handout.
- Transportation to see a physician or to the hospital will be provided by UW Oshkosh Athletic Training.
