Steps to apply for DPI Licensure:

1. Obtain a licensure form from the DPI web page at the above address.
2. Fill out the form and write a check to DPI– or– fill out the credit card information.
3. Return the form and check to the Reading Education Department at N/E 208. We will get the necessary signatures and forward it to DPI.

If you are taking classes for 316 and 317 certification, you must be admitted into the Reading Program.

We can accept only 3 courses or 9 credits taken prior to being admitted into the Reading Education Program.

Course Pre Approval Form:

Be sure to seek approval for any elective or transfer course before you enroll. The course pre-approval form can be obtained from the Reading Education Department, or at http://www.coehs.uwosh.edu/read_ed/forms/frmcersapp.htm

Make sure when you have completed any pre-approval electives or transfer courses to have an official transcript sent to Graduate School or Reading Education. Without an official transcript the course cannot be entered.

* Completing all requirements of MSE does not insure licensure. The Reading Education faculty must positively recommend the candidate for licensure for both 316 & 317.

This conference will explore what it means to be literate at various stages in a child's education. You will learn about critical literacy– the child's comprehension of text– as you listen to those in the profession who mentor and guide a child's interaction and engagement with the printed page.

Every child has wonderful stories to share. Join us to learn about a fully integrated writing workshop. Participants will use real lessons and experience the writing process through a child's eyes. Participants will also receive Department of Public Instruction updates on licensure and learn how to write smart goals and design a professional development plan for license renewal.

You will learn about the rationale and practical strategies necessary to integrate meaningful writing experiences. Participants will explore what we know about motivation and how it can be applied to adolescent literacy instruction for the first generation of kids who have never known a world without the internet.

Keynote speaker Penny Kittle is a teacher at Kennett High School in Conway, N.H. and is a literacy coach at three elementary schools. She is immersed in the daily challenge of teaching student to write thoughtfully and cohesively about what matters to them. She works closely with her mentor, Donald Graves, to videotape teachers in writing process classrooms, capturing the magic of students engaged in writing.
