**General Education Requirements for the BSE, EC-MC and SPED Completion Degrees**

A bachelor's degree requires a greater number of general education credits, or breadth requirements, than an associate of arts and science degree. The list below shows the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh general education requirements needed to complete the BSE degrees and gives examples of some of the most commonly taught UW Colleges courses that will fulfill those requirements. Other courses fulfilling breadth requirements may be offered online. - Clear TB test with documentation of results
- Copy of your current UWO STAR
