

Human Services Leadership Collaborative Degree Program

Transfer and Admission to UW Oshkosh

Prospective Human Services Leadership Collaborative Degree (HSLC) students must first apply and be admitted to UW Oshkosh *prior to* enrolling in courses. HSLC students will typically be considered transfer students from the UW College (UWC) system. For specific instructions, view the online transfer guide found at www.uwosh.edu/admissions/guidelines/transfer/application-procedures. Click on 'College of Education and Human Services' and 'Human Services Leadership'. The application fee will be waived for students who transfer from UW Colleges. Applicant transcripts will be reviewed by the registrar's office.

Admission to UW Oshkosh does not guarantee admission to the Human Services Leadership program. An HSLC program admission means that the student has met certain prerequisites.

UWC credits transfer to UWO, however, all credits from the UWC associate degree program or other institutions may not be applied to the HSLC program degree. See the information on HSL degree requirements for additional details.

Student Advising

Coordinated advising through UWC and UWO keeps students on track for successful transition from the associate (AAS) degree through transfer into the HSLC program, and on to completion. UW Colleges pre-advises students through the AAS degree. Once a student is admitted to UWO, UWO is the official advisor of record. Students must hold a **minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA to enter HSLC courses**. Your UWO advisor will review your STAR report and work with you to develop a plan for program completion. Your plan for program completion will reflect the HSL courses you must take and the sequence you'll take them in order to meet requirements for graduation. The HSLC program is designed as a four consecutive semesters cohort model with new cohorts beginning in fall.

Financial Aid

To accommodate the financial aid needs of students who qualify, *Consortium Agreements* between UWO, the UWCs and other select educational institutions are in place. The agreement allows UWO financial aid recipients who are attending another institution and planning to receive their degree from UWO, to be eligible to receive financial aid from UWO. Such is the case with the Collaborative Degree program. In these cases, UWO is considered the home institution and the other campus is considered the visiting institution. Dual enrollment happens when a student is enrolled at two institutions during the same enrollment period. If the student is enrolled at the UW Oshkosh and at another institution during the same semester, the classes the student is taking at the other school could be counted as part of the total academic enrollment and thus be eligible for financial aid.
