When are applications due?

Friday, May 8th, 2009 at 5 pm

What types of projects are supported by this program?

The program supports development, writing, and submission of requests for external, federal funding of at least \$150,000. Please consult a program liaison (Linda Freed or Michael Briley) if you wish to discuss submitting a proposal for less funding from a non-federal source.

How should applications be submitted to the program?

All applications must be submitted via email as PDF files to Cindy Maas (maasc@uwosh.edu).

How is the University Research Professor/Associate Program related to the UW Oshkosh Faculty Development Program (including the new Grants Mentoring Program)?

The University Research Professor/Associate Program represents a special initiative and operates independently of the UW Oshkosh Faculty Development Program.

How much funding can I request?

Up to \$15,000.

Are there limitations regarding what this funding can be used to support?

Yes. No more than 3 SCH of reassignment time can be requested. Major pieces of equipment are generally not eligible expenses. Proposers are encouraged to contact one of the Program Liaisons with specific budget questions.

Am I eligible to participate in this program?

Only faculty and staff with 0.5 FTE or greater appointments are eligible to apply to the program. People supported in the first year of the program are ineligible.

How do I determine whether the milestones I have set and my strategy for securing long-term external support are appropriate?

All proposers are required to consult with program representatives prior to submitting a proposal. During these consultations, program representatives can provide guidance regarding whether proposer-set milestones and strategies for long-term support are appropriately ambitious but realistic. Generally, milestones and strategies that describe readily measurable outcomes will be deemed appropriate.
