

Original Piggyback Song Assignment

Instructions: A piggyback song is a familiar tune with new words. Teachers often use piggyback songs to help children remember new lesson material. Choose a topic appropriate for any elementary grade level and write your own piggyback song using a refrain or a verse and refrain from a familiar tune.

Steps to follow:

1. Choose a familiar folk tune or children's song melody that you can sing and most students in the class would know. For your new piggyback song, use at least a single refrain (chorus) or verse and refrain. Your song may have several verses if you choose.
2. Write new words for your song that teach something appropriate for elementary grade students--you choose the content area or topic. Make your new words follow a rhyme scheme, and be sure they fit with the melody and structure of your familiar song. Please be sure your new words are appropriate for children. (Write your own new words for this assignment--please don't use someone else's words.) Give your new song a title and identify the tune (see below). Practice your song and be sure you can sing it.
3. Upload your song to the D2L Dropbox. Please save your files in one of these common file formats: .doc, .docx, .pdf, .rtf, .txt. I will assemble them into a single document for the class so we can share one another's songs.
