## *Psychology 302: Honors Abnormal Psychology -- Spring 2007*

Psychology 302: Honors Abnormal Psychology will be offered in Spring 2007! This is a great class, which presents an introduction to understanding behavior that our society or mental health professionals define as deviant, abnormal, or pathological. Major course goals include raising each student's awareness, tolerance, and compassion for those suffering from mental health problems; allowing students to make sense of their own lives and

those they know; and having the opportunity for questions and dialogue with a practicing clinical psychologist who does assessments, psychotherapy, and supervision of mental health professionals. If you are taking Psychology 303 in Fall, please consider arranging your schedule to allow for Honors Psychology 302 in Spring. Dr. Barry Perlman will be teaching the course on Mondays/Wednesdays 1:50-3:20. Don't miss out!

Several times a year, the Oshkosh Public Library (OPL) transforms its basement into a second-hand store where you can "permanently borrow" a surprisingly wide range of good-quality, well-priced books and CDs.

**When: Tuesday, March 28, from 10:00AM to 7:00PM**

**Where: 106 Washington Avenue**

Enter the north side of the building and follow the signs to the basement. (Washington Avenue is east of Main St., opposite Algoma Boulevard.)

The Library, which has served Oshkosh citizens since 1900, was designed by William Waters and is a beautiful example of neoclassical architecture. Proceeds from the book sale usually go to Library improvements; however, profits from March 28 will benefit the library system in Harrison County, Mississippi.

## Oshkosh Public Museum: A Titanic Coup

**Feb. 4-Apr. 30:** It was ninety-four years ago when the engineering and design marvel known as the Titanic made her first and only attempt to cross the Atlantic. While the Titanic's history can compete with the grimmest of tragedies, it is also one that continues to intrigue and grip our imaginations. *Titanic: The Artifact Exhibition*, which will be docked at the Oshkosh Public Museum from Saturday, February 4, through Sunday, April 30, will include some one hundred objects recovered from the wreck plus reproductions of the ship's first- and third-class accommodations. Oshkosh is just one stop on a tour that since 1991 has delighted and fascinated visitors in cities all over the world (Athens, Buenos Aires, Las Vegas, and Seoul to name a few). Come see what the Oshkosh Public Museum calls "the most successful and enduring traveling exhibit in history."

The Oshkosh Public Museum is located at 1331 Algoma Boulevard (at Congress Avenue) and is open Tuesday-Saturday 10:00-4:30 and Sunday 1:00-4:30. The Museum is closed Mondays.

Tickets are \$10 each (\$6 each for groups of 15 more).
