### Travel

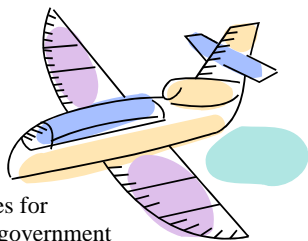
