RESPONSIBILITIES: Develop undergraduate and graduate courses in science or mathematics education and provide professional development for science and/or mathematics teachers via traditional and distance education including online instruction; maintain a record of scholarship and grant development; assist in administering traditional, new and alternative programs directed at initial licensure of secondary mathematics and science teachers and the professional development of currently licensed mathematics and science teachers; and provide service to public schools, the college and university, and the profession.

QUALIFICATIONS Required: Ph.D. or similar terminal degree in science education, mathematics education or a field related and three years of K-12 teaching experience, a documented record of teaching, scholarly activity, professional service, and leadership in science or mathematics education. Experience with K-12 science or mathematics teacher professional development and outreach to K-12 schools.

Preferred: Technological skills needed to develop and deliver courses on-line, interest in coordinating professional development programs and activities for science or mathematics teachers, and supervision of student teachers.
