Notes: *This planning sheet does not establish or constitute a contract between the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh and students enrolled at this institution. The University Administration and faculty, with concurrence of the Board of Regents and the administration of the University of Wisconsin System also retain the right to change fees and to add, modify, or withdraw courses or degree programs at any time.*

Under the provision of the Family Educational Rights Act of 1974, a student is entitled to review any records, files, documents, and other materials defined as education records that are maintained by UW Oshkosh and are released directly to the student. A student may contact the Student Affairs Office, Dempsey 148, for further information.

General Baccalaureate Degree Requirements: All baccalaureate degrees require the completion of at least 120 term earned credits; passing grades of A, AB, B, BC, C, CD, D or P; at least 42 credits of the 120 total must be earned in General Education course work; at least 30 credits of the 120 credits must be earned from the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh; at least 15 credits of the last 30 term credits applied to the degree must be earned at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh; a minimum of 35 of the 120 credits must be earned in upper level (300 or higher) courses. *Credits awarded via transfer agreements with other institutions may result in students having to take additional courses at UW Oshkosh to meet these requirements.*

General Education Requirements: The University Assessment Plan includes the following ten goals for student learning in the General Education program: 1. Effective written and oral communication; 2. Skills related to critical thinking, problem solving and creativity; 3. Heightened intellectual, cultural and human understanding and sensitivity; 4. The ability to manipulate symbol systems and use quantitative methods; 5. Skills associated with the scientific method including rational inquiry, data collection, analysis, theory formulation and hypothesis testing; 6. An understanding of world history, civilization and political processes; 7. An understanding of economic and social sciences; 8. An understanding of the interdependence of humankind and the natural world; 9. An understanding of the principles of mathematics and the sciences; 10. An understanding of literature, the arts and systems of human thought.

Transfer credits: *Credits earned at other accredited colleges and universities are evaluated on the basis of official transcripts submitted as part of the admissions credentials. Course equivalencies are posted to the student's permanent academic record. Keep in mind that posted transfer courses may not meet specific major and degree requirements at UW Oshkosh. The professional college or the department housing the intended UW Oshkosh major determines how courses accepted in transfer apply to the degree and program requirements. A maximum of 72 credits may be transferred to UW Oshkosh from any accredited two-year college.*

Students who have completed an associate degree at a University of Wisconsin two-year UW College may transfer to UW Oshkosh and receive credit for having met some of the General Education requirements. For more information, go to www.admissions.uwosh.edu/transfers.

Grades for courses transferred to UW Oshkosh are not used in calculating the student's official UW Oshkosh grade point average. However, transfer course grades do appear on the transcript and may be used by the professional colleges and departments in determining admissibility into specific programs and majors.

In general, credits earned at **non-accredited** institutions do not transfer or apply toward program or degree requirements at UW Oshkosh. However, the student may appeal this on a course-by-course basis to the department housing the intended major.
