What can Plone do for UWO

- Lets *non-technical* users efficiently create, edit, and publish web pages, documents, news, calendar events, photos, audio, video, and more
- Modules for almost everything else
- It's "free"*

Eliminate the middle man

- Plone is a disintermediator: allows the person with the knowledge to put it on the web quickly
- Immediate content updates** - no waiting for someone to make the change for you
- Improves timeliness & reduces content staleness

Sharing & Intranets

- Collaboration & sharing features - user & group permissions, eg. intranet - private vs. public content
- Can share any documents, pages, and structured data
- Built in support for RSS feed generation

Workflow

- ** Workflow ensures that the right people approve content updates
- Simple approval workflows ---> complex multi-stage, multi-role workflows
- Automatic inbox / outbox management & email notification

Modules, modules, modules

- Surveys, polls
- Discussion forums
- Resource scheduling & booking
- Event registration / signup sheets
- Online forms - the “paperless” campus

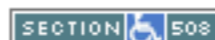

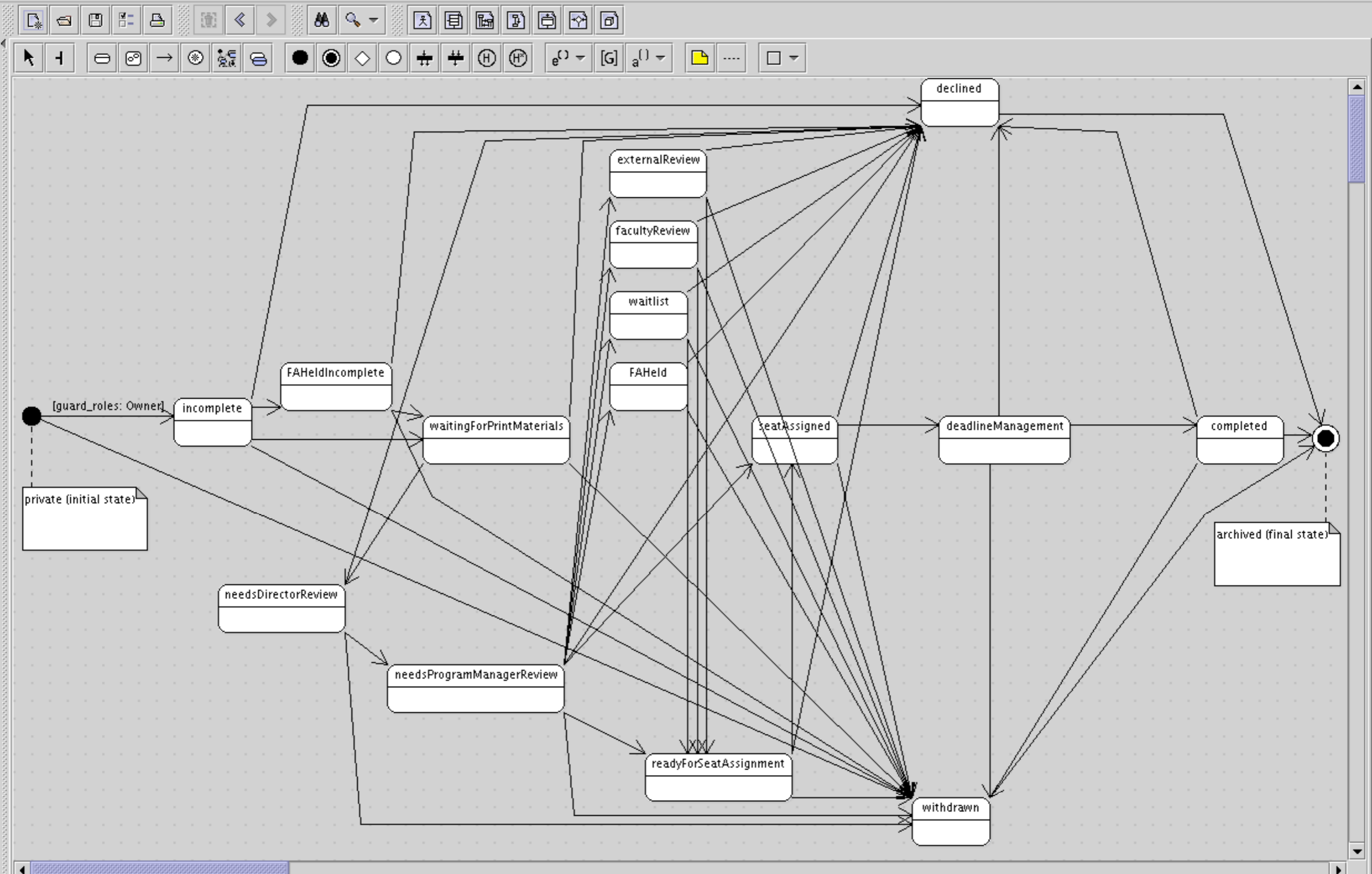

Welcome to the World-class Instructional Design and Assessment (WIDA) Consortium site.

WIDA is a consortium of states dedicated to the design and implementation of high standards and equitable educational opportunities for English language learners.

To this end, the WIDA Consortium has developed English language proficiency standards and an English language proficiency test (ACCESS for ELLs™). In addition, WIDA has developed Spanish language arts standards and is planning a system of alternate academic assessments for beginning English language learners (SUCCESS™). In addition, Research and professional development are integral components of WIDA's missions.

Originally established through a federal grant, the WIDA Consortium consists of twelve partner states: Alabama, Delaware, the District of Columbia Public Schools, Georgia, Illinois, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Maine, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Wisconsin.

These twelve states account for nearly 380,000 English language learners in kindergarten through grade 12 in approximately 2500 school districts.

Starbucks and Ethiopia sign agreement

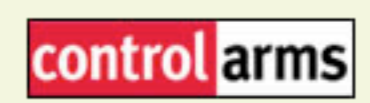
