**Event Three: Using Collaborative Learning Techniques to Survive and Thrive in Large Classes**

This workshop will be presented by Dr. Elizabeth Barkley, author of *Collaborative Learning: A Handbook for College Faculty*. It's designed for faculty and instructional academic staff who are faced with the challenge of large class size (or expanding from its previous enrollment). Recommended by faculty on other UW campuses and across the country, Dr. Barkley is a nationally recognized expert on this topic and her presentational style incorporates extensive use of modeling.

**Event Four: Identifying Solutions to Common Problems in Large Classes**

In this informal conversation with Dr. Barkley, participants will collaborate to brainstorm and share solutions to common problems teachers face in classes with large enrollments.

This workshop, focused on grading student writing in disciplines other than English, will offer practical insight and a helpful rubric based on holistic scoring approaches. Dr. Randall, Associate Professor of English and a consultant to the Tennessee Board of

Regents in holistic scoring, has presented numerous workshops and written manuals on the topic for her state system.
