## Spring 2014 QUEST II Options

### Scheduling my Quest II Paired Courses:

- Meet with an advisor at least 2 weeks prior to your registration date to discuss course options for Spring 2014. Bring your STAR to the appointment. Make sure you call well in advance of when you would like to meet with an advisor to schedule the appointment.
- Review the QUEST II course descriptions on the USP Website and bring some options to the appointment.
- Take a Signature Question different from the one you are exploring in QUEST I.
- Choose a course paired with Speaking if you are in Writing this semester and vice versa. (Unless you already have credit for the other, then do an UNPAIRED QUEST II course.)
- While all the courses are excellent options, review your STAR and confirm with your advisor that you are selecting courses that will satisfy USP and degree requirements.

### When can I take an UNPAIRED QUEST II course?

- Do you have Writing and Speaking Credit earned or in progress? OR Did your advisor approve you for an UNPAIRED QUEST II course? If either of these are the case, then you will take an UNPAIRED QUEST II course.
- If you have a hard time finding a QUEST II pair that works with your schedule ask a PAL or your Peer Mentor for help rearranging your schedule to find one that works. You may have to change the times of your other classes to get the pairing to work. Your advisor can help you prioritize the classes that you need during an advising appointment.
