We agreed on a model with 4 area coordinators in which each would receive two course releases and a half-course release for summer coverage. Additionally, we have 8 program directors who will get one course release each. The configuration of programs that would be in those four areas could change but we felt these two configurations were good contenders. We will be having an all-college meeting to try to sort out broader understanding and agreement. The total amount of release is 54 credits.

- Sociology mentioned the idea of seeing a configuration where they are included with Environmental Studies.
- The idea of putting Anthropology and Criminal Justice in an area with just those two programs was also put forth due to the large size of Criminal Justice and their high interdisciplinarity with Anthropology.
- Programs and faculty/staff should feel free to give thoughts and ideas about placement in the areas.
