

Quest II Version 3.0: Second Year Experience (SYE)

- **Remove sequencing**, can be taken anytime in student's career, but recommend during first two years. [Okay for a second term, first-year student to take]
 - The course would be offered in three "flavors," and students choose ONE of them to suit their particular interests or needs.
 - All SYE courses are Explore courses
- Quest 2: Career connections
 - Explore class with course content
 - Keep Ethical Reasoning component
 - Keep career planning piece, but now looks only at careers related to the school in which the class is taught.
 - Required activities that relate to career planning
- Quest 2: Community connections
 - Explore class with course content
 - Keep Ethical Reasoning component
 - Has a community/service-learning project along lines of Quest 3 (there would be fewer of them, easier to maintain from resource perspective)
 - Required activities that relate to community experience
- Quest 2: Research Connections
 - Explore class with course content
 - Keep Ethical Reasoning component
 - Has research project suitable for first- or second-year students
 - Required activities that relate to research enhancement or project

Key Points

- Having both an FYE course and an SYE course would ensure that all general education students are getting two HIPs, which meets UW System requirements for general education.
- Would align with the AAS degree as well
- Makes use of well-developed curriculum we already have, but lightens the load for Q2 instructors, lets them focus on the area that works for them and their classes

Here's an example of how this might work in History.

- History of Museums SYE: Career Component
 - Ethical considerations: where did those objects come from?
 - Career considerations from point of view of public history work and social sciences
 - Required activities—career planning, job shadowing at Oshkosh Public Museum
