Welcome to the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, NAME!

Your tuition deposit has been received or deferred, and you are now able to complete the remaining post-admission requirements. **Please read this letter carefully and complete the following requirements as soon as possible to ensure you are prepared for your first semester at UWO.**

Access your TitanWeb account.

TitanWeb is UWO's student registration system where students can find their enrollment date, view tuition balances and register for classes. If you have not done so already, access your TitanWeb portal by visiting www.uwosh.edu/tw. Your user ID is a capital "W" followed by your 7 digit ID number. Your password is the first 2 letters of your first name, the first two letters of your last name and the last 4 digits of your Student ID number. All letters should be capitalized. If you would like more information on using the various features of your Titan Web account, tutorials are available on the Registrar's website at <http://www.uwosh.edu/registrar/titanweb/titanweb/student-help>.

Access your UWO Student email, operated through Google.

Your UWO email is how you will receive all future communication from the university. After 48 hours has passed, you can find your email address by searching for your name in the UW Oshkosh Directory at <http://www.uwosh.edu/directory>. To activate your email, visit <http://mail.google.com> and enter your full email address (including @uwosh.edu) as your username. Then enter your 7-digit student ID number as your default password. If you already have a gmail account, you will need to log out of your current account to activate your UWO email.

Activate your UWO NetID.

Your NetID is used for a variety of on-campus resources, including logging onto campus computers, applying for housing, accessing Wifi, etc. Most immediately, you will use your NetID to request an academic advising appointment in the next step.

To activate your NetID, visit <https://netid.uwosh.edu/changePassword> and select "First-time activation." Your username is the first part of your email address (everything before @uwosh.edu) and your initial password is set to your 7 digit campus ID number. Type in your new password and select the "Change Password" button.

Please call Academic Computing at 920-424-3020 if you have trouble activating any of your accounts.

Request your academic advising appointment.

We strongly suggest you request an academic advising appointment as soon as possible. If the major listed at the top of this letter is no longer accurate, select the correct Intended Major when you complete the Transfer Advising Form to ensure you are scheduled with the appropriate advisor. Please complete the following electronic form to request an advising appointment: <http://goo.gl/forms/idTkiJKJrQ>.

You will need your NetID to access and complete the form. You are only able to request an appointment online using this form. At this time, you do not have an assigned advisor but you will be formally assigned an advisor after you have completed your advising appointment.

Transfer students are not required to complete a formal orientation, but an advising appointment is required for all transfer students. If you do not schedule your appointment for your first semester at UWO, a hold will be placed on your account and you will be unable to sign up for classes during your next semester. Advisors will be able to explain college/degree/major requirements and help you interpret your transfer credit evaluation and student academic report (STAR). Your advisor will also help you select coursework for your first semester at UWO. Online students are not required to come to campus and may request a Google video chat appointment.

Send AP and CLEP scores.

If you took any AP tests during high school or you have completed a CLEP exam, you may be eligible for college credit. Students should have all test scores from College Board sent to UW Oshkosh. Scores can be requested at <https://www.collegeboard.org/>. UWO's institution code is 1916.

❑ **Locate enrollment date and enroll in classes, if possible.**

At UWO students receive an enrollment date for each term. Students are not able to enroll for a given semester until their enrollment date. Transfer students are assigned an enrollment date based on the number of credits they transferred into UWO. Students can easily find their enrollment appointment listed in their TitanWeb account on the right hand side of the home page. It can also be found on the student's STAR report (see below).

If you are able to register for your courses prior to your scheduled advising appointment, we recommend that you sign up for courses and then finalize your course selections with your advisor during your appointment.

Students completing an online degree program, including Human Services Leadership and BSN@Home, will not be able to register for classes on their own.

❑ **Sign up for placement testing if you have not completed a college level English or Math course.**

If you have completed a transferable college level Math and English composition course, you do not need to take a placement test. However, if you have not completed a transferable college level course in each subject, you must take a placement test. The majority of transfer students do not need a placement test, but if you are unsure, please contact the Office of Admissions at transfer@uwosh.edu or (920) 424-3164. For placement test dates and availability, please see <http://www.uwosh.edu/testing/test-information/uw-system-placement-test>.

❑ **Review UWO's housing policy and apply for housing.**

Students can apply for housing at <https://www.housing.uwosh.edu/>. Pay attention to housing deadlines!

The Wisconsin Board of Regent's Housing Policy states that all students must live on campus unless they:

- Earned at least 48 credits by first day of classes
- Lived on campus for four semesters, including previous institutions
- Will be 21 years of age by the first day of class.
- Commuting from a parent/guardian's permanent home located within 45 miles of campus.
- Married, veteran, or single parent.

❑ **Apply for Financial Aid.**

Students can apply for financial aid and estimate their potential aid at <https://fafsa.ed.gov>. To ensure you are considered for all types of financial aid, we recommend students file their FASFA as soon as possible. Financial aid differs at each college and does not carry over from previous institutions. UWO's federal school code is 003920.

❑ **Review Transfer Credit Evaluation and STAR Report.**

Approximately two weeks after admission, students will be able to view their transfer credit evaluation and STAR report through their TitanWeb portal. Once you are logged into TitanWeb, click on the drop-down menu on the left hand side that reads "Grades." You will see you can generate a Transfer Credit: Report and STAR Report by selecting the option from the drop-down menu and clicking the double-arrow button.

The transfer credit evaluation shows how courses transfer to UWO, and the STAR report shows how those transfer credits apply toward the student's intended degree and major. Transfer credits will be reviewed and posted to the student's record prior to their advising appointment.

❑ **Visit campus.**

If you haven't already taken a tour of campus, we highly recommend you come check us out! Sign up for a visit at <http://admissions.uwosh.edu/visit-uw-oshkosh/> and familiarize yourself with campus before classes start.

❑ **Send final transcripts.**

Most transfer students are enrolled in coursework at the time of admission. Please send a final transcript to the Office of Admissions once all final grades and degrees are posted by your previous institution. Students will not be permitted to enroll for future semesters if a final transcript is not received by the Office of Admissions within the first month of the semester.
