You are responsible to understand each lab even if you do not write a lab report for it.

Lab Quizzes:

There will be open book quizzes posted on D2L for most labs. They will cover material from lab only. There will be a 30 min time limit, and you must complete the quiz in one sitting (so study before you start the quiz!). You will have until Sunday at midnight to take the quiz for each week – **don't forget!** Questions may be formatted as multiple choice, multiple answer, true/false, short answer, matching, or fill-in-the-blank. Your lowest quiz score will be dropped from your final grade.
