- c. Smithsonian Asian Pacific American Center Internship (<https://smithsonianapa.org/internships/>) – Must complete a research project as part of the internship. Internship is unpaid and students must arrange their own housing. Virtual through 2021
- d. Conference on Asian Pacific American Leadership (<https://www.capal.org/site/>) – offers scholarships and a paid internship in D.C (got from UW Madison)
- e. Gates Millennium Scholars Program (<http://www.gmsp.org/>) – offers good-through-graduation scholarships for African American, Hispanic American,

American Indian/Alaskan Native, and Asian & Pacific Islander Americans.

Students must be incoming freshman who have a 3.0 cumulative GPA, strong leadership abilities, and demonstrated community service

- f. Wisconsin Minority Undergraduate Retention Grants (<http://heab.state.wi.us/programs.html#grants>) – up to \$2,500 per year for up to eight semesters (4 years)
- g. ABA Diversity Scholarship (<http://www.buses.org/scholarships>) – for minority students who want to go into the travel, transportation, or tourism industries
- h. ACS Scholars Program (<http://www.acs.org/content/acs/en/funding-and-awards.html>) – for minority students who are pursuing a career in chemistry, biochemistry, or chemical engineering; must have at least a 3.0 GPA; undergraduate seniors are not eligible
- i. Scholarships (<http://www.scholarships.com/financial-aid/college-scholarships/scholarships-by-type/minority-scholarships/african-american-scholarships/asa-minority-fellowship-program/#more>) – has a ton of scholarships for minority students (left hand panel)
- j. INROADS Internship program – paid multi-year internships for students of color; paired with an INROADS mentor and a corporate mentor; must maintain a B average in school. Available for the following majors: Accounting, actuarial science, engineering, computer and information sciences, sales, marketing, supply chain management, healthcare, and retail store management. Summer Transportation Internship Program for Diverse Groups (STIPDG) (<http://www.fhwa.dot.gov/education/stipdg.cfm>) – Paid summer internship for diverse students interested in working on transportation-related issues. Must be juniors or seniors for fall semester. Partnership between the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). (Rutgers University offers this)
