4. Mentoring and Internships:

Students must be incoming freshman who have a 3.0 cumulative GPA, strong leadership abilities, and demonstrated community service
 - d. Wisconsin Minority Undergraduate Retention Grants (<http://heab.state.wi.us/programs.html#grants>) – up to \$2,500 per year for up to eight semesters (4 years)
 - e. ABA Diversity Scholarship (<http://www.buses.org/scholarships>) – for minority students who want to go into the travel, transportation, or tourism industries

- f. ACS Scholars Program (<http://www.acs.org/content/acs/en/funding-and-awards.html>) – for minority students who are pursuing a career in chemistry, biochemistry, or chemical engineering; must have at least a 3.0 GPA; undergraduate seniors are not eligible
- g. Summer Transportation Internship Program for Diverse Groups (STIPDG) (<http://www.fhwa.dot.gov/education/stipdg.cfm>) – Paid summer internship for diverse students interested in working on transportation-related issues. Must be juniors or seniors for fall semester. Partnership between the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). (Rutgers University offers this)
- h. Breaking Through Barriers (<https://www.msps.nd.edu/academic-initiatives>) – Series of workshops that teach job awareness and career development skills for diverse students. They bring in prominent alumnae and professionals that represent the various groups (offered at the University of Notre Dame)
