

### Admission requirements

### Program

The MBA program is specifically designed to provide working professionals in both the public and private sectors with advanced managerial training. It is one of the largest MBA programs in Wisconsin, with over 3,000 alumni and over 550 currently active students. It is the only program in Northeast and Central Wisconsin to be nationally accredited by AACSB International, recognition of quality earned by less than 20 percent of MBA programs in the U.S.

The MBA degree is designed for students with an undergraduate degree in any area and is taught by full-time, professionally-active, Ph.D. qualified faculty. The average age for someone beginning the program is 30 years old with six to eight years of professional work experience.

While the program enrolls both full-time and part-time students, the evening class schedule is specifically designed to accommodate working professionals with both business and non-business undergraduate degrees. The program is offered in Green Bay, Appleton, and Stevens Point as well as on the UW Oshkosh campus; all courses are also available online. Full-time Ph.D.-qualified UW Oshkosh faculty teach at each location. Several graduate assistantships are available for full-time students.

### Degree requirements

Two structural levels of courses: Foundation and Degree courses. Degree courses are comprised of Management Core, Functional Core, and Electives. General requirements include a minimum of 33 graduate credits in degree courses with additional foundation course work taken as needed depending on previous undergraduate education. Emphases, through electives, are currently available in Health Care, Human Resources, International Business, Marketing, Management Information Systems and Project Management.

### Accreditation

The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). The MBA Program at UW Oshkosh is currently the only master's level business management degree in the Northeast and Central Wisconsin to be accredited by AACSB International – The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, an international recognition of quality earned by less than 10% of business programs worldwide.

#### About the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh

- UW Oshkosh is the third largest of the 13 state-supported universities comprising the University of Wisconsin System.
- The university enrolls about 1,200 graduate students as part of a total student body of about 13,500.
- UW Oshkosh is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools (NCA).

#### Graduate program faculty and services

- Graduate faculty hold doctorates and/or other terminal degrees and professional credentials in their respective fields.
- Outstanding student services, research equipment/facilities, and library resources provide an ideal environment for graduate programs.

#### Financial assistance

- Graduate assistantships are available to eligible students each year.
- The Advanced Opportunity Program offers funds to students of color and non-minority economically disadvantaged students.
- Scholarships may be available through some colleges and graduate departments.
- Loans and student employment are available through the Office of Financial Aid.
- International students are eligible to apply for both graduate assistantships and State-of-Wisconsin nonresident partial tuition remissions.

#### Non-degree-seeking students

- Persons with a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution may take coursework as a graduate special student for professional advancement or enrichment without applying or gaining admission to a degree program.
- Enrollment in courses for non-degree-seeking students is subject to availability and/or approval.

#### Minimum Graduate Studies admission requirements

Admission in full standing to a program requires the applicant to meet the minimum requirements listed below:

- a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution;
- an undergraduate grade point average of at least 2.75 (4.00 scale) or at least 2.90 during the last half (approximately 60 credits) of undergraduate work;
- submission of *official* transcripts of all collegiate work;
- submission of a completed on-line application and payment of a non-refundable \$56 application fee.

Most programs have additional admission requirements such as letters of recommendation, standardized test scores, written personal statements and other portfolio items.
