

Admission requirements

In addition to the minimum Office of Graduate Studies requirements (refer to the other side of this sheet), admission in full standing requires that the applicant meet the following requirements:

30 undergraduate credits in mathematics with a minimum grade point average of 2.75. Courses should include two semesters of calculus, one semester of probability and statistics, and at least two semesters of upper-level, proof-based mathematics.

Program

The MS in Mathematics Education is designed to enhance the professional expertise of practicing secondary and postsecondary mathematics teachers mathematics education content knowledge. We also serve a growing number of professional engineers and others seeking a new career teaching mathematics at technical schools, community colleges, and four-year institutions. Graduate courses by deepening and broadening both their mathematics and are available in the evenings and during summer sessions.

Degree requirements

A minimum of 30 credits chosen so as to meet the following requirements:

- I. at least 18 credits must be numbered 700 or above;
- II. at least 18 credits must have a MATH prefix;
- III. at least two courses must be chosen from among MATH 712, MATH 714, MATH 716, MATH 718, SEC ED 715, SEC ED 739, SEC ED 791 and ED FOUND 770; and
- IV. no more than one ED LDRSHP course may be counted among the 30 credits.

A thesis is optional but a written comprehensive exam is required.

About the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh

- Graduate assistantships are available to eligible students each year.
- The Advanced Opportunity Program offers funds to students of color and non-minority economically disadvantaged students.
- Scholarships may be available through some colleges and graduate departments.
- Loans and student employment are available through the Office of Financial Aid.
- International students are eligible to apply for both graduate assistantships and State-of-Wisconsin nonresident partial tuition remissions.

Non-degree-seeking students

- Persons with a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution may take coursework as a graduate special student for professional advancement or enrichment without applying or gaining admission to a degree program.
- Enrollment in courses for non-degree-seeking students is subject to availability and/or approval.

Minimum Graduate Studies admission requirements

Admission in full standing to a program requires the applicant to meet the minimum requirements listed below:

- a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution;
- an undergraduate grade point average of at least 2.75 (4.00 scale) *or* at least 2.90 during the last half (approximately 60 credits) of undergraduate work;
- submission of *official* transcripts of all collegiate work;
- submission of a completed on-line application and payment of a non-refundable \$56 application fee.

Most programs have additional admission requirements such as letters of recommendation, standardized test scores, written personal statements and other portfolio items. Refer to www.uwosh.edu/gradstudies, the program website, or contact the Graduate Studies Office for more information.
